### Here are some fun ways to make letters


- Make the letters with Playdoh

Make a rainbow!


Using your crayons write a capital letter you have not learnt yet




Write it nice and big in every colour of the rainbow!

 With the same capital letter you have just learnt about, write a list of words that begin with this letter:




- You could draw pictures beside each of these words and colour them in

- Go over all 42 Jolly Phonics sounds with special focus on the diagraph sounds (two letters together that make one sound, eg. ai, ee, etc.)
- Alphabet letter names
- · Recognise and name all capital letters as well as lower case letters
- Days of the week
- Today's date
- Months of the year and seasons
- · What day was it yesterday, today, tomorrow
- Tricky words
- · Reading (to themselves, out loud, rent library books if possible, etc.)

### Additional written work

- Free writing stories, recipes, jokes, get creative!
